Introduction

Twain Harte Valley Mutual Water Company (THVMWC) is a private not for profit water system (California Public Water System ID. CA5500080). Twain Harte Valley MWC is located near Sonora, in Tuolumne County, California.

THVMWC is pursuing state and federal funding programs for Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) to evaluate the replacement of the oldest 127,000-gallon water tank, replace and upgrade much of the existing distribution lines, and replace standpipes with fire hydrants. This will enable THVMWC to provide safe drinking water and to operate more efficiently.

As part of the process to apply for state funding programs, THVMWC needed to establish their Median Household Income (MHI) for the service area. The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) requested that Rural Community Assistance Corporation (RCAC), a private, nonprofit organization, perform the MHI under the Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resiliency (SAFER) technical assistance program for submittal to the SWRCB - Division of Financial Assistance (DFA).

Survey Validity Period

The survey results are valid for up to five years from the date of the final survey report. The Funding Agency holds the right to audit the data five years from the date of the final report. The Funding Agency is not obligated to use the income survey MHI to determine funding eligibility if there is reason to believe the data is no longer accurate.

Survey Rationale

The MHI data available may not be representative of the MHI for the water system service area boundaries and an income survey is needed. The SWRCB-DFA requested RCAC to conduct an income survey to determine the MHI as part of the application process for funding eligibility. The addresses of those surveyed are attached and titled "Resident List of THVMWC" (see Exhibit B, pages 10-13).

Income Survey Methodology

Funding agency guidelines require that an impartial agency conduct the income survey using an approved format.

A unique survey number is randomly assigned to each household receiving a survey questionnaire to maintain the respondent's anonymity. The customer's personal information (name, phone, etc.) is considered confidential and is not provided to any funding agency or other entity. RCAC will retain the original survey forms containing personal information on file at their corporate office, 3120 Freeboard Drive, Suite 201, West Sacramento, California, 95691 for seven (7) years.

THVMWC provided RCAC with addresses for the units used in the survey. RCAC developed the letters and survey form based on the Policy for Developing the Fund Expenditure Plan for the

Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund, Appendix B. Multiagency Income Survey Guidelines established for SWRCB and United States Department of Agriculture Rural Development (USDA-RD) dated August 2021 (see Exhibit C, pages 14-18).

A letter of explanation was mailed and/or delivered on June 30, 2023, to all households within the survey area. The first survey letter and form, and a corresponding postage-paid reply envelope was mailed and/or delivered to each household on July 7, 2023. On July 28, 2023, October 10, 2023, and November 30, 2023, a second, third, and fourth survey letter and a corresponding postage-paid reply envelope was mailed and/or delivered to each household that did not responding to the first, second and/or third survey. RCAC conducted a door-to-door survey of all non-responding residents on August 18, 2023. The survey responses are mailed back to RCAC to maintain customer privacy.

The income survey form listed income categories and requested respondents to provide the total household income from the past 12 months. It also asked the respondent how many people reside at the residence, and if the property is a primary home, secondary home, rental property, commercial property, vacant lot, or vacant home.

The median household incomes for the project service area survey were calculated by RCAC as follows:

The median income is defined as that income in the middle of the data collected from the universe after all incomes are ranked in order from lowest to highest incomes. For example, if there are five houses surveyed, and the five ranks of income are \$10k, \$13k, \$14k, \$19k, \$150k, then **<u>\$14k</u>** is the median income because it is two from the top rank and two from the bottom rank. The median may require averaging if you have an even number of universe data available, and the two incomes in the middle are different.

The definition of household income is the total income in the past 12 months from **all sources**, by all members of one single residence. The results of the survey will be used by SWRCB - DFA to measure the community's ability to finance the project and to determine funding eligibility.

Upon receiving the completed surveys, RCAC calculated the MHI for the project service area community and submitted the data to the SWRCB - DFA. Upon concurrence of the data, RCAC will provide a final report to THVMWC.

Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Data

The Limited English Proficiency (LEP) data from Census.gov, Zip Code Tabulation Area (ZCTA) 95, Table S1601, American Community Survey for languages spoken at home and ability to speak English for populations aged five years and up estimates 1.5% population speak English less than very well. This information was extrapolated for THVMWC and RCAC provided all survey letters and forms in English.

Median Household Income and Response Rate

An income survey was conducted within the THVMWC service boundaries (see Exhibit A, pages 6-9). A summary of the results is listed below with more detailed information in the exhibits. The MHI for this survey counted primary and secondary residences.

The guidelines require that vacant homes have an inactive connection to exclude them from the survey universe. RCAC contacted the SWRCB-DFA and requested approval to exclude two residential connections as vacant homes and provided justification.

There are a total of 116 parcels, within the THVMWC drinking water service area; two are commercial, 10 are vacant lots, and zero are vacant homes with inactive connections, leaving 104 residential parcels (households) to survey. The 78 responses account for a 76 percent response rate. A survey universe with 104 residential households requires a sample size of 82 responses, or 78 percent response rate to meet State and Federal guidelines.

Normally, 82 responses 78 percent response rate, is required for a survey universe of this size. RCAC contacted the State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Financial Assistance and together they determined that even if the four remaining households (needed to obtain the required 82 responses) responded with an income of \$1,000,000 (the highest income reported) the system would still have an MHI of \$66,780. The MHI of \$66,780 is based on 82 responses with a 78.8 percent response rate (see Exhibit D, pages 19-25).

The Median Household Income for THVMWC is \$66,780 (see Exhibit E, pages 26-31).


The results of this survey may be used to support loans and or grant applications to multiple funding agencies, for multiple types of projects benefiting residents within the survey area. Each

funding agency has unique criteria for determining funding awards. A funding agency may look at the survey in terms of whether a community is disadvantaged, the percentage of low to moderate income people in the survey area, the MHI of the survey area in relation to State non-metro MHI's, or other criteria. These factors help a funder determine whether a project is eligible for funding, whether it is eligible for grants, what percentage of grant is available in a grant loan package, or what interest rates the project qualifies for in a loan. Eligibility of a project for funding changes with time, so the funding package available to a project this year might not be the same package available next year.



If I add the two to the universe it does increase the number of responses for USDA RD from 80 to 82 and defaulting four (4) instead of two increased the MHI to \$66,780 (see attachment). Do you want me to move forward with defaulting the four and updating the report to state as much?

This email serves as our formal request for authorization to use additional values due to an inability to meet the sample size requirements.

RCAC conducted three mailings on 7/7/23, 7/28/23, 10/6/23 and a door-to-door survey on 8/18/23. I discussed with Chris Trott, Board President if the board preferred that we mail a fourth notice or conduct another door-to-door survey, and they concurred a fourth mailing would be more productive. The board members contact each of the non-responders to encourage them to participate prior to RCAC mailing out a fourth notice on 11/30/2023. Since I have spoken with Chris Trott, the board feels they have exhausted their efforts to get folks to participate.

Since we were unable to achieve the required minimum sample size, we are requesting authorization to include default values in our calculations. Looking back at 18734 Valley Ave., I think it should be assumed to be a second home and included in the survey universe due to the fact that there is an out of town mailing address, even though the mail came back as undeliverable.

For 23811 Sierra Pines, is the house still habitable despite seeming vacant? If it is still habitable (i.e., exterior is intact, no windows boarded up) then I think we should include this on in the survey universe as well.

Luckily, adding these two properties back into the survey universe does not affect the results at all. It just means the number of residential households should be 104. Then, the minimum SWRCB sample size becomes 76 and the minimum USDA sample size remains as 80. I am assuming these homes are second homes rather than vacant homes, but they do not need to be factored into the second home calculation since they did not actually provide survey responses.


